Is a show in which four artists demonstrate that photography can be more than just an image in a world of 3D cinema and games consoles.

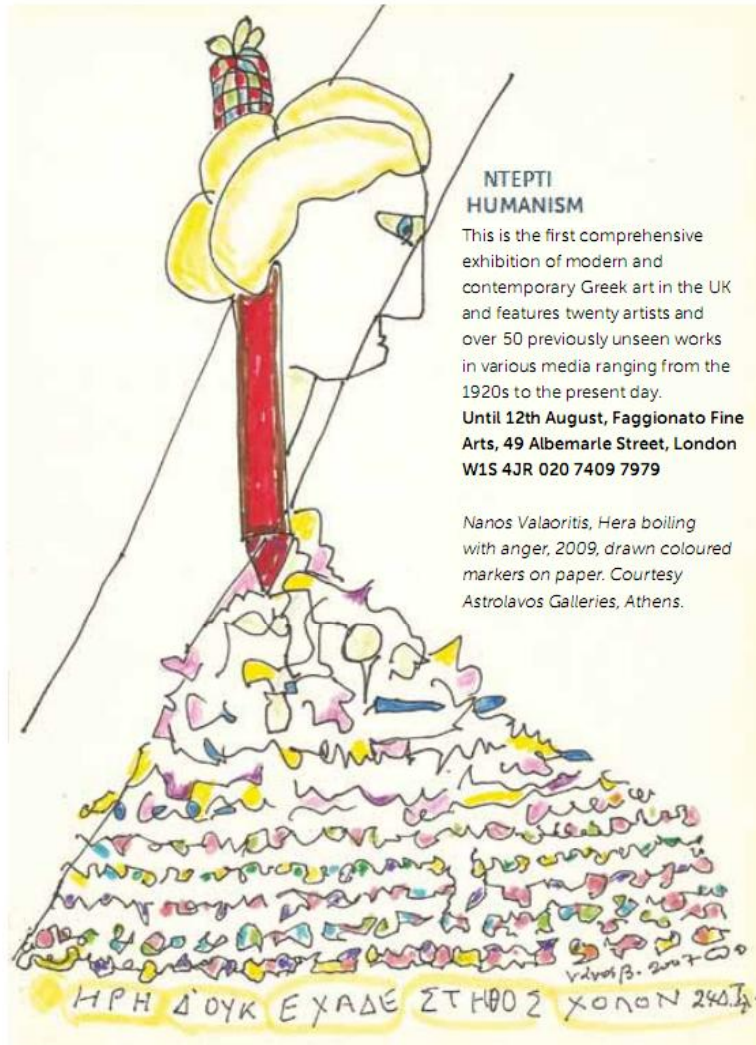
